DATE: 14th December,2022



Event Details:


Participants were given the freedom to choose their own theme, allowing for a wide range of creative expression. The contest required the submission of two logos:


- **AI-Generated Logo:** Created using AI tools, this logo challenged participants to harness the power of technology to produce a unique design.
