Abstract

An offline event called "Seed ball event" took place on July 29, 2023. The event started at 9:00 a.m. Around 6,000 people, including schoolchildren and volunteers, took part in the initiative at Thiyagi N.G. Ramaswamy Memorial Higher Secondary School in the city on Saturday. Over 10 lakh seed balls were made in 30 hours by students and volunteers at the 'Seed Ball Festival, organised by Thiyagi N.G. Ramaswamy Memorial Higher Secondary School and Ruthambra Yoga Centre in the city.

The festival that began on Saturday culminated at 6 p.m. on Sunday. Explaining the efficiency of seed balls, Mr. Sadhasivam said that the seeds would last for nearly two years with an 80% chance of sprouting as they were covered with a mixture of mud, cow dung, and compost. After the seed balls are ready, they will be dropped in select locations with the help of the Forest Department, he added. S.V. Nandagopal, one of the organizers, said seed balls can even be prepared at home using compost and seeds from vegetables and fruits. The festival was inaugurated by Chief Education Officer R. Murugan in the presence of Ruthambra Yoga Centre founder Pathanjali Eswaran on Saturday.



Abstract


Abstract

A Snapshot of the Survey

Before starting the survey, potential questions were anticipated, and an Excel sheet was prepared to record detailed information, including names, family size, contact numbers, addresses, and eye operation needs.

The eye cataract operations will be performed by SATHYAN hospital, with G18 Trust facilitating the procedure at a reduced cost. The survey process provided valuable insights into interacting with people and addressing their queries. Challenges included dealing with some individuals' reluctance and skepticism, but many were engaged and showed interest in the scheme. Some individuals even expressed a willingness to share the information with others.

Ultimately, the team successfully surveyed 100 families and identified 10 elderly individuals ready for the eye operation under the scheme. The experience highlighted the importance of thorough planning and coordination to achieve objectives effectively.

Abstract

Despite these challenges, efforts were made to build trust and encourage participation. The teams visited nearly 40 houses and successfully collected various materials including toys, stationery, bottles, bags, umbrellas, books, and a cricket bat. A total of approximately 20 items were gathered from 15 contributors.

The activity also included surveying individuals who required these materials at a low cost. Despite facing dust and other difficulties, the teams remained dedicated to their task. The collected materials were cleaned and organized, preparing them for distribution at a better price.

Despite facing challenges such as managing a large crowd and individuals who were preoccupied with their daily tasks, the team successfully completed the camp. With 71 attendees surpassing the initial goal, the team demonstrated effective teamwork and communication skills, achieving the objective within the designated time.



Abstract
