


MUDHAL – ADI






“Sometimes, dancing becomes a distraction from evil, and make us happy”


Catch Karo was an open event where the participants were asked to write a brief quote, poetry or song on any one of the topics given below




Subject: Requesting to ensure the safety of every victim of corona and thank doctors and others for their service.







This event was open to all students. This event was conducted in order to enhance writing skills of the students. The participants have made this event, a remarkable and memorable one with their potential and interest.




FAVOURITE TEACHER

MATH CALCULUS




She also spoke about the Difficulties faced by Women in each and every field and overcoming Methodologies of those Difficulties.







It was a Pictionary on road signs where the students were given the role of artist alternatively. The students (apart from the artist) have to guess what road sign the artist is drawing within the given time.





SPORTS PARADE


