Information and Instructions to Candidates

Common application to seek admission to Government and Government Aided Engineering Colleges, University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University, Annamalai University and for the seats surrendered by Self-Financing Engineering Colleges in Tamil Nadu under Unified Single Window Admission System for **Indian Nationals**.

1. ALLOCATION OF SEATS IN COLLEGES

- (i) Seats in Government Engineering Colleges
- (ii) Seats in Aided and self-supporting courses in Government Aided Engineering Colleges
- (iii) Seats surrendered by Central Government Institutions
 - a. Central Electro Chemical Research Institute (CECRI), Karaikudi
 - b. Central Institute of Plastic Engineering and Technology (CIPET), Chennai
 - c. Indian Institute of Handloom Technology (IIHT), Salem
- (iv) Seats in B. E. & B. Tech. Degree Courses in University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University.
- (v) Seats in B. E. Degree Courses in Mechanical Engineering and Civil Engineering (Tamil Medium) in University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University.
- (vi) Seats in B.E. /B.Tech Degree Courses in Annamalai University, Annamalai Nagar, Chidambaram.
- (vii) Seats surrendered by Self Financing Engineering Colleges

A candidate needs to register only one online application for all the courses/colleges/Institutions mentioned above. Candidates seeking admission under special reservation should also give their option for Special Reservation category along with the main online application.

2. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

3. ELIGIBILITY RULES

General

Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of online application are eligible to apply. Passing the qualifying examination or changing the religion after the last date of submission of online application shall not be considered.

Nativity

- i) TamilNadu candidates who have passed VIII, IX, X, XI and XII standard from schools situated in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce Nativity Certificate for verification.
- ii) TamilNadu native candidates who have passed any of the VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. or their equivalent examination from schools situated outside Tamil Nadu can also apply. They should produce **Original Nativity Certificate only in electronic form/digitally signed e-Certificate**.
- iii) Children of Central Government Employees may also apply for admission, irrespective of their native, provided their parents or guardians (only if both parents are not alive) have been serving in TamilNadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** at the time of submission of application. This should be supported by producing a certificate from the employer of the parent or guardian, to that effect.
- iv) Children of employees in Public Sector or Government recognised Institutions who at the time of submission of application for admission employed in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past five years may also apply irrespective of their domicile. A certificate from the employer stating that the person is a Permanent Employee of the Firm or Institution concerned with evidence like Income Tax return, PF Slips, etc. and is working in TamilNadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** has to be produced.
- v) Sons and daughters of All India service TamilNadu cadre officers are eligible to apply. A Self declaration from the parent in this regard is to be produced.

vi) Other State candidates who have studied VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. in TamilNadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce - Nativity Certificate.

Note:

1. Applications without proper Nativity Certificate for Category (ii) without proper employer certificate for categories (iii) and (iv) and without self-declaration from the parent for category (v) will not be considered.
2. Category (vi) need not produce employer certificate / nativity certificate.
3. Categories from (iii) to (vi) will be considered under- Open Competition.

Srilankan Tamil Refugee

As per G.O. (St) No. 172 Higher Education (J2) Dept. dated: 29.06.2010 candidates who are Srilankan Tamil Refugee studied in TamilNadu will be considered under open competition. They have to produce the following certificates.

- (i) Identification certificate from the Head Quarters Tahsildar.
- (ii) Those who have not registered in the refugee camp should produce original passport, visa and letter registered with Police Station.

Overseas Citizen of India Candidates

Candidates of Overseas Citizen of India(OCI) cardholders/Persons of Indian Origin(PIO) cardholders and Native of Tamilnadu shall be permitted to participate in the Tamilnadu Engineering Counselling under the "Open Category" from the academic year 2023-24 onwards. This will not be applicable to the candidates of overseas citizen of India (OCI) cardholders/ Persons of Indian Origin(PIO) cardholders who are born in a foreign country after 04.03.2021 .

Qualifying Examinations and Eligibility

A **pass** in the HSC (**Academic: both +1 and +2**) or its equivalent with a minimum average percentage as given below.

Note:

- (i) When the candidates produce grade certificates, they have to produce the actual marks also, otherwise only the minimum marks applicable to the grades in the eligible subjects (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Fourth Optional Subject) will be taken into account.
- (ii) For minimum eligibility rounding of marks and normalized marks will not be considered.

Improvement marks: As per the G.O. No. 184 HE (J2) Dept. dt: 09.06.2005 and G.O. (st) No. 143 HE (J2) Dept. dt: 06.05.2008 improvement marks obtained by the candidates including Other State candidates from 2006 onwards will not be considered.

Marine Engineering Branch

The Director General of Shipping, Ministry of Shipping, Government of India, vide Notification No. II. TR (21) 97 dated: 03.10.2002 have issued notification stating that, for Marine Engineering Degree Programme the candidate should pass in 10+2 or equivalent examination with Physics (P), Chemistry (C), Mathematics (M) and English as separate subject with an average of not less than 60 % in PCM. Further a minimum of 50 % in English either at 10th or 12th standard is required for all the candidates.

In addition to the above, The Director General of Shipping, Ministry of Shipping, Government of India, vide Notification No. IMU-HQ/C/12/18/01/CET-2022 Dated:07.03.2022 have issued notification stating that the result of Common Entrance Test (CET) conducted by IMU on behalf of Directorate General of Shipping is must for B.E. Marine Engineering Programme from the academic year 2022-2023 onwards

Other Requirements:

- (i) Maximum age limit 25years.
- (ii) Minimum Height 157cm.
- (iii) Minimum Weight 48kg.
- (iv) Normal Colour vision.

Before selecting the course, the candidate shall ensure that they are medically fit for the course.

The candidates will be admitted only on production of physical fitness certificate obtained from the Medical Officer authorized by the Director General of Shipping, failing which they will lose the admission.

Mining Engineering Branch

Note to Female candidates opting for Mining Engineering course.

- (i) As per Mines Act 1952, 46(1) no woman shall, not with standing anything contained in any other law, be employed— in any part of a mine which is belowground;
- (ii) In any mine above ground except between the hours of 6 A.M. and 7 P.M.
- (iii) As per Coal Mines Regulation 1957, 86(2) no adolescent or women shall descend or ascend as haft in a cage or other means of conveyance unless accompanied by one or more adult males.
- (iv) They should satisfy the academic norms of Anna University.

4. ALLOCATION OF SEATS

Selection shall be made under seven categories namely OC, BC, BCM (BC Muslim), MBC & DNC, SC, SCA and ST following the rule of reservation of Government of Tamil Nadu as follows.

4.1 The 7.5 percentage seats on preferential basis for Government School students who have studied from 6th to 12th standard in state Government Schools as prescribed under the Act will apply to all categories of reservation including the "General Category". (G.O.(Ms) No. 167, Higher Education (J2) Department. Dated:31.08.2021).

4.2 (a) Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu (**Annexure – I** on Page No.21-27).

4.2 (b) The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained permanent community certificate (for SC/ SCA /ST / MBC&DNC, BC and BCMuslim candidates) **in permanent card format/ electronic form/ digitally signed e-Certificate** only from the authorities given below on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community Certificate obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered.

4.2 (c) Community Certificate obtained from **other states** will not be considered for communal reservation.

4.2 (d) For communities linked with Districts (**See Annexure-I**) the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective district except the communities mentioned in G.O. (st) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dt: 28.10.2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.

4.2 (e) Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community [Card] Certificate or electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate, their application will be treated under "Open Competition (OC)".

The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions & rules prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of OC, their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

4.2(f) ST/SC/SCA/MBC&DNC/BC/BCM candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition in addition to the reservation made for them.

5. SPECIAL RESERVATION
Special Categories

The special reservation categories and the quota for these categories are given in the Table. Candidates are instructed to produce appropriate certificates and supporting documents for special reservation claim. If appropriate certificates and documents are not produced, their claim under such categories will not be considered.

5.1 Only Tamil Nadu Native candidates are eligible for Special reservation.

All disabilities will be assessed as per the certificates shown in the Information Brochure.

Note:

(i) Candidates claiming admission against the reservation of seats under Sons / Daughters of Ex-Servicemen Category (Sl.No.1) should produce the certificate in the format (Certificate No.III) from an officer of the Department of Ex-servicemen's Welfare of Tamil Nadu not below the rank of Assistant Director of Ex-servicemen's Welfare of the district in which the dependent is a native. **Candidates should also produce discharge certificates and Ex- Servicemen ID card of their parent.**

(ii) Candidates seeking admission against reservation set apart for Visually Impaired, Hearing impaired (Deaf), orthopedically Differently Abled Persons, Autism, Multiple disabilities should produce the certificate from the **Medical Board (minimum 3 doctors) of the District** concerned certifying the nature and **extent of disability in percentage** and with regard to his/her suitability for admission to Engineering Colleges specifically mentioned under 5.2 and in the format (Certificate No. IV/V/VI/VII/VIII). Certificates obtained from an **individual Doctor** will not be considered. **Further, a separate medical Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates.**

(iii) Candidates seeking admission against special reservation of seats under Eminent Sports Persons (Sl. No. 3) should upload their original sports certificates along with appropriate forms as given in **Annexure III**. Separate instructions will be given later after the completion of registration process.

(iv) Candidates seeking admission against seats under Special reservation categories (Sl. No. 1 to 3) **should also satisfy the eligibility rules mentioned in item No. 3 of page number 1.** The candidates are also eligible for admission **under general counselling.**

5.2 Eligibility criteria for various disabilities

A. Norms for Visual Impairment

Candidates with low vision of 40% and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. IV).

1. **"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—
 - (i) total absence of sight; or
 - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
2. **"Low-vision"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—
 - (i) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
 - (ii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree upto 10 degree.

Person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:

- (a) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees, (b) Heminaopia with macular involvement, and (c) Attitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction.

* ONE EYED persons with normal vision are not considered as disabled.

B. Norms for Hearing Impairment

Candidates with hearing ability of 40 db and above only in the better ear with speech discrimination score of 50 % and above are considered disabled and hence eligible for claiming Engineering Admissions against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. V).

1. **"Deaf"** means persons having 70DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.
2. **"Hardofhearing"** means person having 60DB to 70DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

C. Norms for Locomotor Disability

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy of the following types are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. VI).

1. **Locomotor disability** (a person's inability to executed instinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both).
 - (i) Independent in ambulance with **or** without calipers but without walking aids. (ii) Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support. (iii) Hand Function with normal limit without any aid. (iv) Good control over bladder & bowel. (v) Disease must be non-progressive.
2. **"Leprosycured person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
 - (i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
 - (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - (iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from under taking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosyncured" shall be construed accordingly;
3. **"Cerebral palsy"** means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
4. **"Dwarfism"** means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10inches (147 centimeters) or less;
5. **"Muscular dystrophy"** means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human

body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

6. "Acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

D. Norms for Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40% and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness of the following types are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (CertificateNo.VII).

1. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (i) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental alaphasia;
- (ii) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereo typical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour—"mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub-normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

- (i) chronic neurological conditions, such as—
 - (a) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelization and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
 - (b) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neuro transmitter dopamine.
- (ii) Blood disorder—
 - (c) "hemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor would may result in fatal bleeding;
 - (d) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.
 - (e) "Sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

E. Norms for Multiple Disabilities

Candidates with multiple disabilities with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled and they are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. VIII).

Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. MODE OF SELECTION

(a) (i) ADMISSION TO GENERAL CATEGORY

The selection of candidates will be based on the marks obtained in the prescribed subjects reduced to 200 (Mathematics:100, Physics:50, Chemistry : 50) in the qualifying examination.

(ii) Normalisation of Marks and Inter-se Merit

As per Tamil Nadu Acts No.3 of 2007, dt: 05.03.2007 and G.O. (Ms) No.77 HE (J2) Dept, dt: 05.04.2007, the marks obtained by the students in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by various Boards or Authority shall be equated with the marks obtained by the students in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the State Board of Tamil Nadu by adopting the method of normalisation.

(e.g.) If the highest mark secured by the student of State Board of Tamil Nadu in Physics is 100 and the highest mark secured by a student of any other Board in the same subject is 90 both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same Board is 90, 60 marks will be considered to be equal to 66.66 marks as arrived below.

$$(60/90) * 100 = 66.66\%$$

After normalization of marks in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by different Boards, the qualified students shall be merged into a common meritlist.

In the case of candidates who have qualified from **National Boards** namely CBSE and ISCE, the highest mark obtained in the relevant subject by the candidates at the National Level alone will be taken into consideration for normalisation.

The Other Boards will be requested to furnish the maximum marks scored in the relevant subjects. In case, such marks are not available before the preparation of rank, the maximum marks scored in that Board will be considered as 100 %.

For minimum eligibility, normalised marks will not be considered.

A merit list will be prepared based on the total mark of 200. In cases where more than one candidate have got the same marks in the common merit list, the inter-se-merit among such candidates shall be determined in the order of priority as specified below.

(i) percentage of marks in Mathematics (ii) percentage of marks in Physics (iii) percentage of marks in the optional subject (iv) percentage of total marks in 12th Standard Examination (v) date of birth (elder will be given preference) and (vi) Random number Assigned (higher value will be given preference)

The overall rank and Community wise rank lists will be published in Directorate of Technical Education website

<https://www.dte.tn.gov.in> or <https://www.tneonline.org>. Separate announcement will not be given in Newspapers. The college and the branch will be provisionally allotted through online counselling only, *as per their choice, based on their overall rank and community rank.*

(iii) Admission under Special Reservation Categories

Candidates who are applying for seats under special reservation categories as in Sl.No.1, 2 and 3 (Refer section 5.1) should satisfy the rules stipulated for admission. Allocation of these Special Reservation seats will be followed as per communal reservation.

Selection for Sl.No.1 Sons/Daughters of Ex-Servicemen and Sl.No.2 Persons with benchmark disabilities will be based on the ranking as given in 6(a) (i) and (ii).

Selection for Sl.No.3 Eminent Sports Persons will be based on the total marks obtained for achievements in Sports as per **Annexure-III.**

If any vacancy arises it will be reverted to the general counselling in the respective communities.

(b) ADMISSION OF VOCATIONAL STREAM CANDIDATES

2% of Government seats in Government colleges, government aided engineering colleges, Anna University Departments, Anna University Constituent colleges, Annamalai University and seats surrendered by self-financing colleges, Central Electro Chemical Research Institute(CECRI)-Karaikudi, Central Institute of Petrochemicals Engineering & Technology(CIPET)-Chennai, Indian Institute of Handloom Technology (IIHT)-Salem, is allowed under vocational category for Tamil Nadu Engineering Admissions from the academic year 2022-23 onwards as per G.O.(Ms.)No.121 HE (J2) Dept. dt:30.06.2022 for the HSC(vocational stream) candidates. The HSC marks in the prescribed subjects will be reduced to 200 (Mathematics100marks, vocational subject including theory and practical 100 marks). Selection will be made following the Communal reservation. Ranking and counseling will be separate for vocational candidates.

5 % Vocational seats are reserved for Differently Abled Persons category.

(c) ADMISSION TO SANDWICH COURSES

Sandwich courses in Mechanical Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering and Production Engineering are offered at PSG College of Technology **under self-financing scheme**. The duration of the course is 5 Years. It comprises of practical training in the mornings and class work in the evenings. There will be an additional fee payable towards practical training and it will be intimated by the Principal of the college at the time of admission.

(d) ADMISSION TO M.TECH COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING COURSE

This Integrated course in computer science and engineering is offered at some self-financing colleges. The duration of the course is 5 Years.

7. TUITION FEE CONCESSION

7.1 Full Fees Waived for Those Admitted Under 7.5% Reservation For Government School Students.

As per the GO 221 Higher Education (J2) Dated: 15.11.2021, The State government will absorb the expenses for education in professional courses of students admitted under the 7.5% reservation for government school students. The fees for counselling, tuition and hostel, would be paid by the government itself. They have to submit the proof for Government School study details from 6th Standard to 12th standard. The following categories of schools are classified as Government schools.

1. Government Schools
2. Corporation Schools
3. Municipal Schools
4. Adi Dravida And Tribal Welfare Schools
5. Kallar Reclamation Schools
6. Forest Department Schools
7. Schools Managed by Government Departments

7.2 First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession

In the G.O.(st) No.85 Higher Education(J2) Department dated:16.04.2010, the Government have ordered to grant tuition fee concession to the candidates who are to be the first graduate in a family, those who are attending counselling and joined in professional courses in Government / Aided and Self-Financing Engineering Colleges. They have to submit the following:

Certificate obtained from Head Quarters Deputy Tahsildar in the format prescribed in G.O. **Electronic form/ digitally signed e-Certificate only will be accepted** which necessarily should include name of applicant's father, mother, father's father, father's mother, mother's father, mother's mother, brother(s) and sister(s) and joint declaration by himself and parent/guardian in the prescribed format.

If the applicant's Brother or Sister has already availed First Graduate Tuition Fee concession for studying Professional Courses, then the applicant is not eligible for such concession.

7.3 AICTE Tuition Fee Waiver (TFW)Scheme

This scheme is applicable in Self-Financing Engineering Colleges and Self-Supporting courses in Government Aided Engineering Colleges only. AICTE Tuition fee waiver scheme is applicable for B.E./B.Tech. courses only. Seats up to a maximum of 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course may be available under the scheme. Tuition fee waiver under First Graduate scheme is provided by Government whereas, AICTE TFW scheme is provided by the Management of the Institution. Sons and daughters of parents whose annual income is less than *Rs.8.0 lakhs* from all sources shall only be eligible under this scheme.

All other fees except tuition fee will have to be paid by the candidate under both (7.2) & (7.3). Beneficiary student admitted under AICTE TFW scheme will not be allowed to change Institution / course under any circumstances.

7.4 Post Matric Scholarship

In the G.O. (st) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012, G.O. (st) No. 92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012 and G.O. (st) No. 16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 24.02.2014, the Government have ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to SC/SCA/ST candidates and SC/SCA converted Christians, whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 2,50,000/- from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from appropriate authorities and get the Post Matric Scholarship from the colleges where they get admitted.

8. Procedure for Registration of Application

A Candidate seeking admission to first year B.E/ B. Tech degree courses under unified Single Window Admission System [TNEA 2024] should apply online for the registration of his candidature on the web site www.tneaonline.org or www.dte.tn.gov.in from anywhere. For the convenience of candidates, TNEA Facilitation Centers (TFC) have been established in selected cities. Candidates can use the facilities available in TFCs. The candidate who satisfies the eligibility conditions as given in Section 3 of Information and Instructions to Candidates has to register his/her name by providing a username and password. The candidate has to remember his/her username and password for further login and fill-up the application. The candidates must be ready with details such as

- i. Mobile phone number
- ii. E-mail ID
- iii. 10th Marksheet
- iv. +2 Marksheet
- v. School details where he/she has studied from 6th to 12th standards
- vi. Community/ Caste details
- vii. Aadhar card [Aadhar number details](Optional)
- viii. Parent annual income details
- ix. Credit card/ Debit card/ Net-banking/ UPI/ Demand Draft details for paying registration fee
- x. The candidate should exercise their option whether he/she is applying for seats reserved under special reservation categories such as
 - a) 7.5% reservation for Government School Students
 - b) Son/daughter of Ex-servicemen
 - c) Differently abled persons
 - d) Eminent sportsperson
- xi. The candidate should give option whether he/she wants to avail
 - a) First graduation Fee concession
 - b) Post-matric scholarship

The candidate has to fill up the details in the application form. The candidate can give their preference of TFC for online Certificates Verification. The entered details can be viewed using the login information. The applicant can edit his/her information if necessary. Verify the entries made and if all the details are found correct then submit the on-line application on or before the last date. Applicants will be provided with a PDF document on successful registration of application through TNEA Application Processing System

10. Online Choice: Filling and Confirmation (Online Counselling)

- A) **Preparation of Merit list:** A merit list will be prepared based on the marks obtained in the relevant subjects, namely, Maths, Physics and Chemistry which will be reduced to 200 (Maths – 100, Physics – 50 and Chemistry–50). The overall rank is prepared based on the merit list with the defined procedure for tie- break (Refer Section. 6 of Information and Instructions to candidates). The overall rank and community rank will be published in the official TNEA Web portal (<https://www.tneaonline.org> or <https://www.dte.tn.gov.in>). A week is reserved for addressing applicants' grievances after the publication of the rank. In case of grievances, applicants can contact the office of the Secretary, TNEA at Directorate of Technical Education, Chennai 600025.
- B) **Counselling:** The applicants will be grouped based on their rank and each group of applicants will be allowed to participate in counselling according to their turn. TNEA 2024 will have multiple rounds of counselling. The applicant has to login in to the TNEA portal by using his/her user ID and Password (same as that used at the time of registration) for performing various activities in a particular round. The procedure for each round of counselling is as follows:
- C) **Publication of eligible applicants:** The list of eligible applicants for a particular round will be published in the TNEA portal.

11. Online Counselling Procedure

- Counselling will be conducted online in multiple rounds as per the Schedule.
- Candidates will participate in corresponding rounds based on their rank

- Each round has 4 stages
 1. Choice Filling
 2. Tentative Allotment
 3. Confirmation of Tentative Allotment
 4. Reporting to College/TFC and payment of fees depending upon their confirmation
- In each round the following procedure will be followed
 - A candidate will be given three days for the choice filling wherein the candidate will have to fill their choices of colleges and branches based on their preferences. The order of choices is important. A candidate can fill any number of choices.
 - Candidate's allotment will be based on the preferential order of choices based on their rank and the eligible seat matrix.
 - During Allotment stage, if the candidate is allotted a seat, then the following below mentioned options will be shown for confirming the seat. The candidate must confirm their seat within 2 days from the date of allotment. Failing to confirm the allotted seat, candidate will be taken to next round.
 - Various confirmation options
 1. **Accept and Join**
 - Candidate who is satisfied with the seat allotted, can download the provisional allotment order and can report to the college on the specified date for admission. Candidate will lose his/her allotted seat if failed to report to the college. Such not-reported candidates cannot participate in any subsequent rounds.
 2. **Accept and Upward**
 - Candidate is satisfied with the seat allotted but wishes to wait for allotment in the higher order of his/her choice in the ensuing upward movement. For example, if the candidate is allotted seat for choice 5, he/she can wait for choices 1,2,3,4. In case no better choice is available in upward movement, then candidate is confirmed with the previously allotted choice 5.
 3. **Decline and Upward**
 - Candidate is not satisfied with the allotted seat therefore he/she declines the allotment, but prefers to wait for allotment in the higher order of his/her choice in the ensuing upward movement. If he/she is unable to get his/her preferred allotment in upward movement, then the candidate will be moved to the next round.
 4. **Decline and move to next round**
 - Candidate is not satisfied with the allotted seat. Also, candidate do not wish to wait for upward movement and he/she is willing to participate in the next round.
 5. **Decline and Quit**
 - Candidate is not satisfied with the allotted seat and he/she do not wish to participate in subsequent rounds also.
 6. **Upward or move to next round**
 - If 'no seat' is allotted to the candidate based on all the choices, then this option will be shown. Such 'no seat' allotted candidates can opt for upward movement. In case if seat is available during upward movement, it will be allotted. If no seats are available during upward movement, then candidate will be moved to the next round.

- All candidates who are satisfied with the currently allotted seat and have opted for "Accept and Join" must download the allotment order and report to the college within 5 days and complete the admission procedure by paying the necessary fees (Candidates who have been allotted seat in government 7.5% quota and candidates who have uploaded the required certificates for first graduate scholarship or Post matric Scholarship are exempted from paying the fees). Non-admission in the college will be considered as not willing to join and the allotment order will be cancelled.
- All candidates who are satisfied with the currently allotted seat and have opted for "Accept and Upward" will be given tentative allotment order. They must report to the nearest TFC and pay the tuition fees and submit their original certificates for holding the current seat. (Candidates who have been allotted seat in government 7.5% quota and candidates who have uploaded the required certificates for first graduate scholarship or Post matric Scholarship are exempted from paying the fees). Non-reporting and non-payment of fees, will be considered as not willing to join and the allotment order will be cancelled. Such candidates will lose allotted seat and will not be considered for further rounds in counselling.
- During every round, before start of upward movement, seats of candidates not reported to college and seats of candidates not reported to TFC are pooled and will be considered for upward movement.
- The Original Certificates of the candidate who report at TFC for confirmation of upward by paying their tuition fees and surrendering their original certificates will be transferred to provisionally allotted college. If the candidate is not willing to join the provisionally allotted college, then the candidate should report to the provisionally allotted college and get their original certificates in-person and 75% of fees paid at TFCs will be refunded to the candidate after all the approval process is over.

Counselling for (i) Eminent sports persons, (ii) Differently abled persons, (iii) Sons and daughters of Ex-service men, (iv) Vocational candidates and (v) supplementary counselling and counselling for vacant seats of SCA will be held in online only. Applicants must ensure that all online counselling activities like adding choices, locking choices, tentative allotment, submission of allotment option and final allotment are performed at the official TNEA web portals (<https://www.tneaonline.org> or <https://www.dte.tn.gov.in>) only.

1. The purpose of this quota is to recognize and give weightage to the sports eminence of the candidates and hence marks for sports achievements alone will be considered in ranking the candidates. The candidates are expected to continue their good performance in sports, even after admission.
2. The candidate shall submit **all the sports certificates along with participation certificates and relevant forms** issued by Association / Federation recognized, but only one highest achievement in a tournament (among the International, National, State, Regional and District) in an academic year will be considered for awarding marks.
3. Selection of the candidate will be based on the marks obtained by the candidate strictly following the guidelines, given in the tables.

Eligibility for athletes requires participation in an event involving at least seven different countries and such competitions should have been approved by Indian Olympics Association (IOA), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Government of India. Open or Invitational or Memorial or any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments or Championships at International level, not approved by any of the above authority will not be considered for marks.
Category - III	Asian Championships, Commonwealth Games, World cup, World Championship, Grand Prix, Grand slam - Organized in Every year by the International Sports Federation. Eligibility for athletes requires participation in an event involving at least seven different countries and such competitions should have been approved by Indian Olympics Association (IOA), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Government of India.

- 1. Participation or achievement in International tournaments will be considered only with earlier achievements at National and State level tournaments. Direct participation / Selection trials / Camps any International or National tournaments will not be considered for award of marks.**
2. The highest achievement in only one annual regular tournament, officially conducted in a regular manner by the member National Olympic Committee (NOCs) authorized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) or International Sports Federations affiliated to the IOC will be considered for award of marks. The players/sports persons representing the Country in such tournaments through Indian Olympic Association (IOA) or respective National Sports Federations recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India or IOA will be considered for award of marks in each year.
3. Only tournaments officially recognized by the Indian Olympic Association / respective official National Federations will be considered for the award of marks (for each year) from 01.06.2020 to Last date of submission of application (01.06.2020 to 31.05.2021, 01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022, 01.06.2022 to 31.05.2023 and 01.06.2023 to Last date of submission of application).
4. Certificates of Participation or Achievements in tournaments, submitted along with Form I alone are eligible for marks indicated in Table (I) above (should be submitted before the last date for submission of application).
5. Players who participated in any of the categories I, II and II, in Table(I) should produce the copies of the following:-
 - i. VISA, Immigration entry in passport, clearance from Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (Government of India), Indian Olympic Association and respective National Sports Federations including BCCI.

- ii. The fixture, draw, schedule of events, players' accreditation, National Medal, Merit, Diploma, Participation certificate and Form-I issued by the respective National Sports Federation and certificates signed and issued in the prescribed format by the President or Secretary General of the National Olympic Committee of the Organizing Country and International Federation.

4 (b). For National Tournaments

1. National tournaments should have been officially be recognized as the regular annual championship / tournament by MYAS or IOA or SAI or SDAT or SGFI Nationals conducted every year by school education department in age groups (U-14, U-17, U-19) or respective official National Sports Federation will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
3. Tournaments conducted by the Federations which are not recognized by the IOA or MYAS, TNOA or SDAT at National level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.
4. Candidates must have participated at Zonal Cluster, District, Regional, State, National and International in a particular Game/Sport in the same hierarchical order as per the existing norms applicable for a particular Game/Sports.

4 (c) For State Tournaments

1. State level tournaments should officially be recognized as the regular annual championship or tournament by respective official State Association or SAI or SDAT or School Education Department of Tamil Nadu will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
3. Any tournaments conducted by the Association which are de-recognized by the SDAT at State level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

4 (d) For Tamil Nadu Board CBSE/KV Schools / CISCE - Sports Achievements

1. Tamil Nadu Board schools, KV / CISCE and CBSE Schools, Zonal and cluster level achievements will not be considered.
2. The candidates participated in the tournament conducted by CBSE and KV Schools, at Regional / South Zone are equated to Regional Level Achievements, and the National Level Achievements are equated to State Level of State/ Matric Board Schools.

5. General Conditions

1. For consideration of candidates seeking admission under the category of eminent sports person, he/she should enclose all the attested photo copies of participation certificates and the relevant forms issued by the competent sports authorities. **The application along with all the sports certificates /relevant forms/documents as given in 4(a) 5. should be presented for certificate verification which will be done at College of Engineering Guindy Campus, Anna University , Chennai.**
2. Participation / achievements in each academic year **from 01.06.2020 to 31.05.2021, 01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022, 01.06.2022 to 31.05.2023 and 01.06.2023 to Last date of submission of application** in sports / games shown in the list alone will be considered for the award of marks. National or State Level Championships or Tournaments conducted by Sports Federations or Associations recognized by MYAS or IOA or SDAT or TNOA alone will be considered for the award of marks. (Recognition of State Associations / National Federations should be relevant to the year concerned).
3. Relevant attested copies of certificates issued by the competent authorities as detailed below are to be submitted along with the application before the last date for receiving the applications.
4. Open or Invitational or Memorial or any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments or Championships at District or State or National or International level will not be considered for marks.
5. District or Inter-District Championship means the championships conducted by the respective recognized District or State Sports Association for a Revenue District or Revenue Districts in the State of Tamil Nadu.
6. Direct participation or achievement at any level without participating in the qualifying level competitions such as District or State or National or direct selection conducted by District or State Sports Association or National Sports Federation to represent the District or State or National or International tournaments or championships will not be considered for award of marks.
7. For International achievements in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver and Bronze will be awarded to players who are ranked first, second and third respectively in the ATP or WTA rankings of International Tennis Federation for awarding participation marks for the top **5 ranked** players will be considered from the ATP or WTA list published by the International Tennis Federation. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.

For National or State level achievement in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver and Bronze will be awarded to players. who are ranked first, second and third respectively in the AITA or TNTA at National or State.

For awarding participation mark the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the list published by AITA or TNCA at National or State level based on the ranking. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.

8. Certificates should be in printed form and necessary Form-I and II should be in prescribed format. (Certificates or forms issued in letter pads will be invalid).
9. All other sport disciplines in which ranking is the criteria for assessment of achievement, rules indicated in item 8 above will be applicable for the award of marks.
10. For Cricket, the annual official Championships or tournaments conducted within the country under the auspices of TNCA or BCCI at District or State or National Level alone will be taken into consideration for that year.
11. Multiple events in a particular sport must be standardized events and in accordance with the events organized by the approved International Federations. Events newly created and not in accordance with the requirement will not be considered for award of marks.

12. Participation or achievements of candidates with nativity of Tamil Nadu who represented Tamil Nadu alone are eligible for marks under National Category.

13. Only Tamil Nadu candidates are eligible to apply for admission under Sports Quota and only the KVS and CBSE schools within Tamil Nadu are eligible for marks.
14. A Common Committee for Engineering and Medicine constituted for this purpose will rank the candidates based on the marks assigned to the certificates enclosed along with the application. Candidates with a minimum sports mark of 5 and above alone will be considered for ranking.

15. All the achievement certificates are to be supported necessarily by the relevant participation certificates and appropriate forms.

16. No further enclosures or certificates will be entertained after the last date for submission of completed application, in person.
17. Highest achievement or participation certificates obtained by candidate at different levels such as District or State or National or International in each year along with earlier achievements should be enclosed without fail. (A candidate shall enclose copy of all eligible certificates for scrutiny).
18. Candidates in proportion to the available seats will be called to appear before the Common Committee for Engineering or Medicine for verification of the Originals, followed by counseling after ranking.
19. If any candidate fails to produce the requisite Original Certificates or Forms, his/her place will be allotted to the candidate next in rank and so on. The consequential vacancy at the end of the rank list will be filled up from among the additional candidates according to their ranks.
20. All the highest level of participation or achievement should be supported by earlier achievements at all levels of competition.
21. Short listed candidates will be called for counselling based on their rank and branches and colleges will be allotted according to their choices from the number of seats reserved under sports quota based. Sports quota counselling will be held before the commencement of general counselling.
22. Candidates securing admissions under Eminent Sports Persons quota should sign an undertaking at the time of receiving allotment order assuring participation in sports activities in the college preferred by them.
23. Legal action would be taken on parents and candidates for furnishing bogus documents. They should ensure that the certificates obtained are from competent authorities.
24. A candidate can utilize the Sports Quota only once for Engineering or Medicine.


**Sub: National Sports Development Code of India, 2011 - Inclusion of relaxation provision
- regarding**

The National Sports Development Code of India, 2011 (Sports Code) has been in force since 31.01.2011. The Government has also, from time to time, issued certain other guidelines and instructions with regard to governance and management of Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and National Sports Federations (NSFs). It has been decided to add the following relaxation clause provision at No. 16 under the Heading of Relaxation Clause of the Sports Code 2011 at page 32:

Relaxation clause:

"Government shall have the power to relax any of the provisions of the National Sports Development Code of India, 2011 and other instructions issued with regard to recognition of National Sports Federations (NSFs), renewal of recognition of NSFs on annual basis and governance and management of Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and NSFs, as a special exemption where considered necessary and expedient for the promotion of sports, sportspersons or to remove difficulties in giving true effect to that particular provision of the Sports Code, always being guided by and not inconsistent with the overarching spirit of good governance and ethical conduct enshrined in the Sports Code 2011. The reasons for such relaxation shall be recorded in writing. Power to relax the provisions will vest with Minister In-charge of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports."

2. This issues with the approval of Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Youth Affairs & Sports.



1. ALLOCATION OF SEATS IN ENGINEERING / ARTS & SCIENCE COLLEGES

1.1 Seats in the Engineering Colleges and Stand Alone Institutions under the purview of the Directorate of Technical Education, Chennai 600 025 are grouped into the following categories:

- (i) Seats in Government Engineering Colleges.
- (ii) Seats in Government Aided Engineering Colleges.
- (iii) Seats in Anna University Departments / Regional Centres / Annamalai University and others.
- (iv) Seats surrendered by Self-financing Engineering Colleges and Stand Alone Institutions.

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2. ELIGIBILITY RULES

The Eligibility for Admission to First Year MBA Degree Programme is given below:

General:

Candidates satisfying the eligibility rules as follows as on last date of submission of application are eligible to apply. No change in claims made in application will be permitted after the last date for submission of application. Only Indian Nationals are eligible to apply.

2.1 Nativity :

- (i) Tamil Nadu candidates who have studied and passed out in Tamil Nadu as noted below are eligible to apply. They need not produce the Nativity Certificate.

- (ii) Children of Central Government Employees may also apply for admission, irrespective of their native, provided their parents or guardians (only if both parents are not alive) have been serving in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** at the time of submission of application. This should be supported by producing a certificate from the employer of the Parent or Guardian, to that effect.
- (iii) Sons and daughters of All India Service Tamil Nadu cadre Officers are eligible to apply. A Self declaration from the parent in this regard is to be produced.
- (iv) Children of employees in Public Sector or Government recognized institutions who at the time of submission of application for admission employed in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** may also apply, irrespective of their domicile. A certificate from the employer has to be uploaded along with the application stating that the person is a Permanent Employee of the Firm or Institution concerned and is working in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past five years. Evidence like Income Tax return, PF Slips, etc., should be produced.
- (v) Other state candidates who have passed the examinations as noted under 2.1 (i) above, in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce - Nativity Certificate.
- (vi) Tamil Nadu native candidates who have passed any of the XI std., XII std. and Diploma / Degree examination as noted under 2.1 (i) from the institutions situated outside Tamil Nadu, can also apply. They should produce **Original Nativity Certificate only in electronic form/digitally signed e-Certificate**

Note:

1. Applications without proper employer certificate for Categories (ii), (iii) and (iv) above and nativity certificate for the category (vi) will not be considered.
2. Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. Others will be considered under "Open Competition".
3. Degree holders, only with 2 years regular full time Teaching / Industrial experience in the relevant field after successful completion of the course including project work. An experience certificate is to be produced by the candidates.

3.2 (a) Tamil Nadu Native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservations. The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu. **(Annexure – I)**

- (b) The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained permanent community certificate (for ST / SC / SCA / MBC & DNC / BCM / BC) in **Permanent card format/ electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate** only from the authorities given below on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community Certificate obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered.

- (c) Community Certificate obtained from **other states** will not be considered for communal reservation.
- (d) For communities linked with Districts (See Annexure – I) the candidates should obtain their community certificates in the respective districts except the communities mentioned in G.O. (St.) No. 95 Backward, Most Backward and Minorities Welfare Department, Dated 28-10-2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.
- (e) **Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community [Card] Certificate or electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate, their application will be treated under “Open Competition (OC)”.**
- The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions and rules prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of OC, their application are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

4. SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- (a) The selection shall be made on the basis of the marks secured in the TANCET 2024 Entrance Examination. If there is a tie (same marks obtained in TANCET 2024 by more than one candidate) while preparing the rank list, the candidates will be ranked as per following inter-se merit rules:
- (i) Average % of marks from first semester / year to N-1 semesters / years in the qualifying Degree examination where N is the total no. of semesters / years in the qualifying examination.
 - (ii) Date of Birth (Candidates elder will be given preference)
 - (iii) Random Number assigned (higher value will be given preference)

(b) Candidates should produce the proof of pass in the Degree Examination (Degree Certificate / Provisional Certificate/ Mark Sheets of all Semesters of Degree Examinations) during the certificate upload phase. Candidates who do not produce the proof of pass in Degree Examination will not be considered for allotment.

(c) The candidates are informed that the allotment given in the counselling are only provisional. In accordance with rules prescribed for admission, if they are found ineligible on actual verification of original certificates by the Principal / Directorate of Technical Education, they cannot claim any right for admission or continuation of study at whatever stage of study they may be.

5. SPECIAL RESERVATION

5% of seats under government quota are reserved Differently Abled candidates. Candidates seeking admission against this reservation should produce the certificate from the **Medical Board of the District** Concerned certifying the nature and extent of disability in percentage and with regard to his / her suitability for admission to MBA Programme specifically mentioned in the format appended to this application (Certificate No. I / II / III / IV / V) respectively. Certificates obtained from an **individual Doctor** will not be considered. **Further, a separate Medical Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates.**

5.1 Eligibility criteria for various disabilities

A. Norms for Visual Impairment (Certificate No. I)

Candidates with low vision of 40 % and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming MBA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. "Blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction —

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

2. "Low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 or up to 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

Person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:

- (a) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees, (b) Heminaopia with macular involvement, and (c) Altitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction.

B. Norms for Hearing Impairment (Certificate No. II)

Candidates with hearing ability of 40 db and above only in the better ear with speech discrimination score of 50 % and above are considered disabled and hence eligible for claiming MBA Admissions against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. "Deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

2. "Hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

C. Norms for Locomotor Disability (Certificate No. III)

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy of the following types are eligible for claiming MBA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute instinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both).

(i) Independent in ambulence with **or** without calipers but without walking aids. (ii) Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support. (iii) Hand Function with normal limit without any aid. (iv) Good control over bladder & bowel. (v) Disease must be non progressive.

2. "Leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- (i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

3. "Cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

4. "Dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;

5. "Muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

6. "Acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

D. Norms for Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness (Certificate No. IV)

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness of the following types are eligible for claiming MBA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (i) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- (ii) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour — "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

- (i) chronic neurological conditions, such as—
 - (a) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelization and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
 - (b) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
- (ii) Blood disorder—
 - (c) "hemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
 - (d) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.
 - (e) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

E. Norms for Multiple Disabilities (Certificate No. V)

Candidates with multiple disabilities with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled and they are eligible for claiming MBA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

- (iii) Seats in University Departments of University of Madras, Chennai and Others
- (iv) Seats surrendered by Self-financing Arts and Science Colleges and Stand Alone Institutions.

1.3 As a part of the regulations, Candidates admitted in the MCA Degree Courses shall have to satisfy the conditions prescribed by the respective Universities.

1.4 Duration of the Programme

MCA	2 Academic years comprising of 4 semesters
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2. ELIGIBILITY RULES

The Eligibility for Admission to First Year MCA Degree Programme is given below:

General:

Candidates satisfying the eligibility rules as follows as on last date of submission of application are eligible to apply. No change in claims made in application will be permitted after the last date for submission of application.

Only Indian Nationals are eligible to apply.

2.1 Nativity :

- (i) Tamil Nadu candidates who have studied and passed out in Tamil Nadu as noted below are eligible to apply. They need not produce the Nativity Certificate.

- (ii) Children of Central Government Employees may also apply for admission, irrespective of their native, provided their parents or guardians (only if both parents are not alive) have been serving in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** at the time of submission of application. This should be supported by producing a certificate from the employer of the Parent or Guardian, to that effect.
- (iii) Sons and daughters of All India Service Tamil Nadu cadre Officers are eligible to apply. A Self declaration from the parent in this regard is to be produced.
- (iv) Children of employees in Public Sector or Government recognized institutions who at the time of submission of application for admission employed in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** may also apply, irrespective of their domicile. A certificate from the employer has to be uploaded along with the application stating that the person is a Permanent Employee of the Firm or Institution concerned and is working in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past five years. Evidence like Income Tax return, PF Slips, etc., should be produced.
- (v) Other state candidates who have passed the examinations as noted under 2.1 (i) above, in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce - Nativity Certificate.
- (vi) Tamil Nadu native candidates who have passed any of the XI std., XII std. and Diploma / Degree examination as noted under 2.1 (i) from the institutions situated outside Tamil Nadu, can also apply. They should produce **Original Nativity Certificate only in electronic form/digitally signed e-Certificate**

Note:

1. Applications without proper employer certificate for Categories (ii), (iii) and (iv) above and nativity certificate for the category (vi) will not be considered.
2. Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. Others will be considered under "Open Competition".
3. The Tamil Nadu native candidates who belong to category under Item No. 2.1 (vi) and claim Tamil Nadu Nativity shall submit application along with a copy of Nativity Certificate in the prescribed format obtained from Tahsildars of their Native place in Tamil Nadu. Such of those applications received without copy of the Nativity Certificate shall be treated as incomplete application and shall be rejected.

Srilankan Tamil Refugee:

As per G.O. (Ms.) No.143, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 14.06.2011 and G.O.(Ms.) No.159, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 4.7.2011 candidates who are Srilankan Tamil Refugees studied in Tamil Nadu will be considered under open competition. They have to produce the following:

- (i) Identification certificate from the Head Quarters Tahsildar.
- (ii) Those who have not registered in the refugee camp should submit a copy of passport, visa and letter registered with Police Station (with proof of Srilankan Tamil Refugee like TC etc.).

2.2 Qualifying Examinations and Eligibility

(a) A pass in B.C.A/ B.Sc. (Computer Science)/ B.Sc. (IT) / B.E. (CSE)/ B.Tech. (IT) or equivalent Degree. **OR** a pass in any graduation degree (e.g.: B.E. / B.Tech. / B.Sc / B.Com. / B.A./ B. Voc./ etc.,) preferably with Mathematics at 10+2 level or at Graduation level.

Obtained at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of candidates belonging to reserved category – BC / BCM / MBC & DNC / SC / SCA / ST) in the qualifying degree examination.

- (a) 10 + 2 + 3 / 4 / 5 years pattern (or)
- (b) 10 + 3 years Diploma* + 3 years pattern (or)
- (c) 10 + 2 + 2 years Lateral Entry Diploma* + 3 years pattern (or)
- (d) (i) 10 + 2 + AMIE** (or)
(ii) 10 + 3 Years Diploma* + AMIE**

* Awarded by the State Board of Technical Education

** Candidates with section 'A' & 'B' certificates and other similar certificate issued by professional bodies or societies (e.g. A.M.I.E) recognized by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India and enrolled with Institutions with permanent recognition upto 31-5-2013 are eligible to be considered equivalent to B.E. / B.Tech. Degree holders, only with 2 years regular full time Teaching / Industrial experience in the relevant field after successful completion of the course including project work. An experience certificate is to be produced by the candidates.

- (b) In case of B.E./ B.Tech., in addition to regular mode of study, Lateral Entry and Part time modes are also considered to be eligible.
- (c) Candidates with B.E. / B.Tech. Degrees obtained through Distance mode / Week end courses are not eligible.

- (d) Candidates with Degree obtained in arts and Science Colleges without studying 10th, 12th Std are not eligible.
- (e) Candidates admitted through Lateral Entry in UG Degree courses of Arts and Science Colleges are not eligible.
- (f) The qualifying UG Degree awarded by Universities should conform to the minimum standards of instruction for Grant of the First Degree through Formal / Non-Formal / Distance (Wherever applicable) Education prescribed by UGC.
- (g) Candidates who have already passed the above qualifying Degree course and candidates who are appearing for the final semester / year examination of the said qualifying Degree course except certificates issued by professional bodies or societies such as AMIE etc., during April / May 2024 may apply for admission to **MCA** Degree Programme. However, candidates should provide evidence for having passed the qualifying degree examination at the time of admission to the Institutions.

2.3 Computation of minimum eligibility marks in the qualifying examinations

The average percentage of marks obtained by the candidate in the entire duration of the qualifying UG Degree (semester / Yearly pattern) course after exclusion of marks for extra curricular subjects (NCC, NSS, YRC, YOGA etc...) will be considered for computation of minimum eligibility marks.

2.4 Entrance Examination

Candidates should have appeared for the TANCET 2024 (MCA) Examination conducted by Anna University Chennai, Chennai 600 025 and should produce TANCET 2024 (MCA) Mark Sheet issued by Anna University Chennai, Chennai 600 025.

2.5 Age Limit

There is no age limit for admission to MCA Degree Programme.

3.1 Selection shall be made under Seven categories namely OC, BC, BCM (BC Muslim), MBC & DNC, SC, SCA, and ST following the rule of reservation of the Government of Tamil Nadu as follows:

- 3.2** (a) Tamil Nadu Native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservations. The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu. **(Annexure – I)**
- (b) The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained permanent community certificate (for ST / SC / SCA / MBC & DNC / BCM / BC) in **Permanent card format/ electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate** only from the authorities given below on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community Certificate obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered.

- (c) Community Certificate obtained from **other states** will not be considered for communal reservation.
- (d) For communities linked with Districts (See Annexure – I) the candidates should obtain their community certificates in the respective districts except the communities mentioned in G.O. (St.) No. 95 Backward, Most Backward and Minorities Welfare Department, Dated 28-10-2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.
- (e) **Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community [Card] Certificate or electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate, their application will be treated under "Open Competition (OC)".**

The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions and rules prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of OC, their application are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

- (f) ST / SC / SCA / MBC & DNC / BC / BCM Candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition in addition to the reservations made for them.

4. SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- (a) The selection shall be made on the basis of the marks secured in the TANCET 2024 Entrance Examination. If there is a tie (same marks obtained in TANCET 2024 by more than one candidate) while preparing the rank list, the candidates will be ranked as per following inter-se merit rules:
- (i) Average % of marks from first semester / year to N-1 semesters / years in the qualifying Degree examination where N is the total no. of semesters / years in the qualifying examination.
 - (ii) Date of Birth (Candidates elder will be given preference)
 - (iii) Random Number assigned (higher value will be given preference)
- (b) Candidates should produce the proof of pass in the Degree Examination (Degree Certificate / Provisional Certificate / Mark Sheets of all Semesters of Degree Examinations) during the certificate upload phase. Candidates who do not produce the proof of pass in Degree Examination will not be considered for allotment.
- (c) The candidates are informed that the allotment given in the counselling is only provisional. In accordance with rules prescribed for admission, if they are found ineligible on actual verification of original certificates by the Principal / Directorate of Technical Education, they cannot claim any right for admission or continuation of study at whatever stage of study they may be.

5. SPECIAL RESERVATION

5% of seats under government quota are reserved Differently Abled candidates. Candidates seeking admission against this reservation should produce the certificate from the **Medical Board of the District** Concerned certifying the nature and extent of disability in percentage and with regard to his / her suitability for admission to MCA Programme specifically mentioned in the format appended to this application (Certificate No. I / II / III / IV / V) respectively. Certificates obtained from an **individual Doctor** will not be considered. **Further, a separate Medical Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates.**

Candidates seeking selection against the seats under Special Reservation Categories **should also satisfy the eligibility rules mentioned in item No.2 of page number 1**. The candidates are also eligible for admission **under general counselling**.

5.1 Eligibility criteria for various disabilities

A. Norms for Visual Impairment (Certificate No. I)

Candidates with low vision of 40 % and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming MCA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. "Blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction —

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

2. "Low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 or up to 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

Person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:

- (a) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees, (b) Heminaopia with macular involvement, and (c) Altitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction.

B. Norms for Hearing Impairment (Certificate No. II)

Candidates with hearing ability of 40 db and above only in the better ear with speech discrimination score of 50 % and above are considered disabled and hence eligible for claiming MCA Admissions against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. **"Deaf"** means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.
2. **"Hard of hearing"** means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

C. Norms for Locomotor Disability (Certificate No. III)

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy of the following types are eligible for claiming MCA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute instinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both).

(i) Independent in ambulence with **or** without calipers but without walking aids. (ii) Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support. (iii) Hand Function with normal limit without any aid. (iv) Good control over bladder & bowel. (v) Disease must be non progressive.

2. "Leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- (i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

3. "Cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

4. "Dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;

5. "Muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

6. "Acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

D. Norms for Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness (Certificate No. IV)

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness of the following types are eligible for claiming MCA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

1. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (i) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- (ii) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour — "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

- (i) chronic neurological conditions, such as—
 - (a) "Multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelization and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
 - (b) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
- (ii) Blood disorder—
 - (c) "hemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
 - (d) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.

(e) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

E. Norms for Multiple Disabilities (Certificate No. V)

Candidates with multiple disabilities with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled and they are eligible for claiming MCA Admission against Differently Abled Persons category.

Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

7. BAN ON RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Section 4 and 5 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997 contain the following:

Section 4 : Whoever directly or indirectly commits, Participates in, abets or Propagates Penalty for "Ragging" within or without any educational institution, shall be punished with ragging imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Twenty Five Thousand rupees.

Section 5 : Any student Convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.
