On September 25,26&27,2023, a mock interview session was conducted for final-year Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE) students, facilitated by Ms. Priya from Byts. The session aimed to provide students with practical experience in handling job interviews, preparing them for the transition from academic life to professional careers.

Ms. Priya, an industry expert with extensive experience in recruitment and career coaching, led the session. The mock interviews were designed to simulate real-world scenarios, including both technical and behavioral questions pertinent to the ECE field. Each final-year student participated in a one-on-one interview, receiving feedback tailored to their performance. The session also included a brief presentation on effective interview strategies and common pitfalls to avoid.

Key outcomes of the mock interview session were highly positive. Students demonstrated notable improvements in their ability to handle technical and behavioral questions. The session allowed them to practice articulating their skills and experiences clearly, addressing technical challenges, and responding to behavioral scenarios with greater confidence. Participants reported a significant boost in their confidence levels. The practical experience of participating in a simulated interview environment, coupled with expert feedback, helped reduce anxiety and increase their preparedness for actual job interviews. The personalized feedback was crucial in highlighting each student's strengths and areas for improvement. This guidance was instrumental in helping students refine their responses, enhance their problem-solving explanations, and improve their overall interview performance. The session provided valuable insights into industry

expectations and interview practices, equipping students with knowledge on how to navigate the job market effectively.
